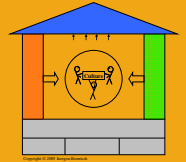

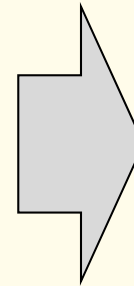

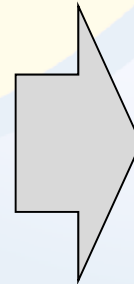
- Lean Tools

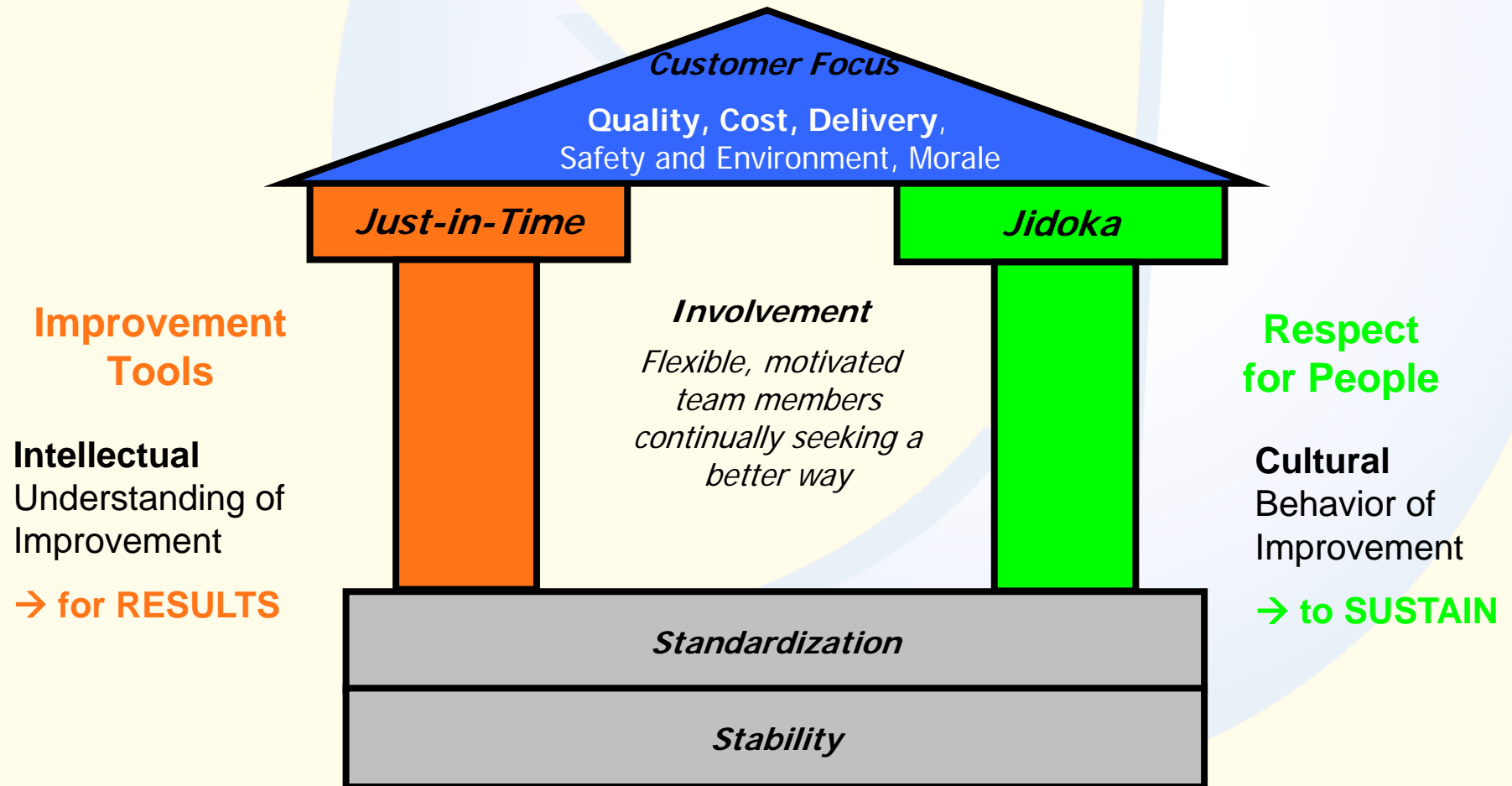

Effective Lean Implementation requires both! → Tools and People – and at the same Time

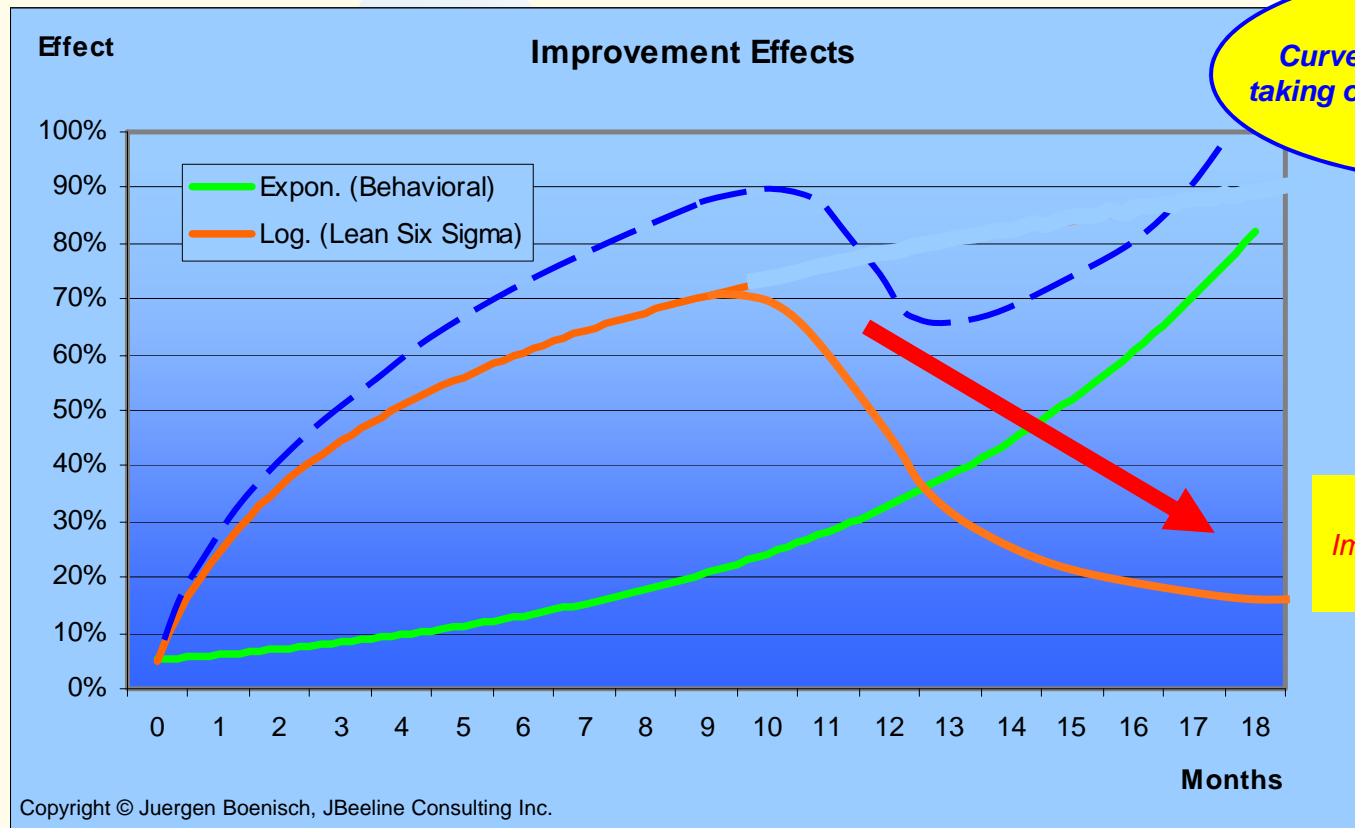
The Toyota House
